- engages over 300 skilled volunteers in the community







Understanding our skilled volunteers

- 26% of people living people living in Boroondara volunteer, the highest rate in metro Melbourne
- 43% of residents hold a tertiary qualification (compared to Greater Melbourne at 24%)
- 49% of local resident workers hold a Bachelor degree or higher
- 55% of employed Boroondara residents aged 15 years and older work in managerial or professional occupations







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













Supporting community organisations

What are the benefits?

Skilled professionals:

- utilise professional skills to support a specialised task or project
- embark on long term, ongoing relationships
- share their expertise and personal experience beyond the short term project they initially signed up for
- apply their skills in a not-profit context



Attracting, engaging and retaining volunteers

- Openness to professionals approaching your organisations to offer their skills
- Consideration for volunteer flexibility
- Developing discrete, project-based and meaningful roles with a tangible outcome
- Shaping a volunteer role based on project objectives, rather than task requirements (where possible, cocreating the role with the skilled professional)





Karen's top tips to engaging skilled volunteers

- Pitch the role to the audience you are targeting, using language that is familiar to the skilled volunteer you are seeking
- 2. Be succinct and specific about the duties involved
- 3. Provide a definitive time frame
- 4. Talking is key! Pre-interview, interview and talk through the assignment
- 5. Give progressive feedback
