4. Chair's Report on the 2020 - 2021 Annual Report

Bronwen Clark confirmed that the 2020 - 2021 Annual Report was circulated to Members on 24 November 2021 and is available on the Volunteering Victoria website. She made a few brief comments, noting the ongoing challenges to the sector. She confirmed that the Report evidences that Volunteering Victoria had lived its values of collaboration, innovation and accountability. She highlighted a number of the great successes of Volunteering Victoria during the period of the Report, including:

- the ISO Quality Accreditation which was achieved in August 2021, making Volunteering Victoria one of the few community organisations to obtain this international certification;
- the proactive and rigorous approach taken by Volunteering Victoria to the changes to the funding under the Volunteer Management Activity;
- advocacy by Volunteering Victoria through numerous submissions, events and involvement on the Victorian Volunteer Strategy task force.

Bronwen Clark outlined a number of strategies which were re-enforced during this reporting period, including continuing to advocate strongly for viable place-based volunteering services; and the commencement of a pragmatic strategy around equity, diversity and inclusion, with the submission of Volunteering Victoria's Reconciliation Action Plan (Reflect) for endorsement by Reconciliation Australia.

5. Financial Report for the Year Ended 30 June 2021

Bronwen Clark welcomed and introduced Michael Wilson, Deputy Chair and Treasurer of Volunteering Victoria, to deliver the organisation's 2020/2021 financial report.

Michael Wilson provided a quick overview of the Financial Report. He confirmed that the auditors have agreed that the financial statements present fairly and they accurately reflect the financial situation at Volunteering Victoria up until the end of June 2020. He noted that Volunteering Victoria remains in a solid financial position. Revenue increased substantially during the reporting period partially due to the new funding streams, as did expenses, including an exceptional item being a an historical SCHADS award leave loading liability going back 6 years which was addressed by management. Volunteering Victoria had developed a number of solid financial processes which would ensure that reporting standards remain high. He noted that a surplus is predicted in 2022.
